
Bare branches, swirling snowflakes, and early darkness. Warm boots, snug hats, and bright mittens. Holiday celebrations, sledding, and football. Winter is here!

Young children will best understand winter as a time when certain changes take place around them and particular events, activities, and holidays occur. This month the children will learn that:

- Winter is the season between fall and spring.
- In winter, the weather turns colder. It snows in many places and rains in others.
- Animals adapt to the cold weather by hibernating, migrating, growing thicker fur, or storing food.
- To prepare for winter, some plants drop their leaves. Others die back to the roots or die completely.
- People wear warmer clothing and heat their homes and cars.
- People enjoy a variety of activities, sports, and holidays during winter.



Each January Celebration Preschool holds an Open House for parents who are interested in learning more about the preschool and the registration process for the following school year. This year's Open House will be held on Wednesday, January 15th at 6:30 PM. # The First Day of Winter by Denise Fleming

This book follows the same pattern as the holiday song, "The Twelve Days of Christmas," only in this version, it repeats, "On the first day of winter my best friend gave to me ...." It's told from the snowman's point of view, and at the end of the book, the snowman is finished and ready for winter.

## Winter Lullaby by Diane White

This story is about a little bear questioning why it needs to go to bed for the winter when all the other animals appear to be awake and up. But, gently mama bear explains that each animal will find shelter for the winter and they need to do the same. For when it is spring, they will wake up together.

#### Tracks in the Snow by Wong Herbert Yee

Providing opportunities for gross motor play is an important component of our daily schedule. Gross motor skills are movements that involve using the large muscles of the body. As children age, their gross motor abilities continue to develop and improve. Children rely on gross motor skills to engage in physical play. We are very fortunate that we have Pickell Hall to use on days when the weather is not conducive for outside play. There are some weather conditions that we consider before taking the children outside. The "feel like" temperature must be above 32 degrees. When we have extended periods of rain or melting snow the playground becomes quite saturated as the ground covering is mulch. Sometimes we have to let the playground "dry out" in order to provide our preschoolers with an environment that provides for their health and safety.

### When to Keep Your Child Home from Preschool

When children spend time close together, germs can spread between them. Knowing when to keep your child home sick from preschool helps protect other children from illness. It can also give your child a chance to get extra rest they may need to recover.

Viruses responsible for colds or the flu cause the most common sicknesses in preschool. Even through your child has had immunizations, they can still get sick with colds, sore throats, coughs, vomiting, and diarrhea.

Any child with respiratory illness symptoms (cough, runny nose, or sore throat) and a fever should not attend preschool. Our sick policy states that children need to be free of a fever (without the use of fever-reducing medicine), vomiting, and diarrhea for 24 hours before they can return to preschool.

Our expectation is that children should feel well enough to participate in classroom activities. We are unable to exclude anyone from the daily activities. We appreciate your understanding as we work together in keeping all of our preschoolers and staff safe and healthy!
