ROUTINES

Daily routines let your child know what to expect. Plus, they help him develop skills like time management, organization, and planning. Here are some strategies that you can try.

Count down. Use a timer to keep your child on track when he is getting dressed or picking up toys. He may enjoy trying to beat a time set for 5 minutes - and then trying to beat 4 ½ minutes the next day.

Clean up. Help your child come up with an organized way to store his toys. He might sort them by putting blocks into a basket, action figures into a shoebox, and books on a shelf.

Plan ahead. Let your child keep his own calendar and draw symbols on it to signify special days. For instance, on days he has baseball practice, he could draw a baseball. Together, check his calendar each night, and talk about his plans for the next day.

Is your child tattling or telling? Explain that he should ask himself whether he is trying to get someone into trouble (reporting his little sister for playing with his toy) or helping someone out of trouble ("Holly is touching the stove knob!"). If he is helping, it is not tattling.



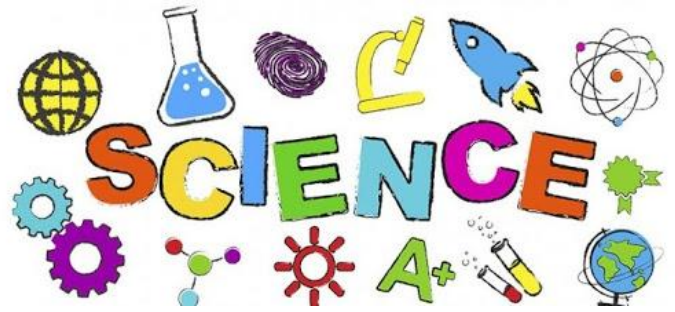

In January, the Dragonflies and Fireflies explored the five senses. A child's first learning tools are his five senses. Through them he explores his world. He sees and feels the tiny, hard golden kernels of corn. He hears their bursting and popping sound and smells them as they change and grow. Finally, he tastes them, warm and buttery, and learns about the pleasure of that favorite snack-time treat - popcorn!

The children will enjoy this experiential unit. The following concepts are ones that young children can easily understand:

- We use different parts of our bodies to learn about our world.
- Our eyes see the colors, shapes, and sizes of things.
- Our ears hear warning sounds like sirens, helping sounds like doorbells, and identifying sounds like barking.
- Our tongues tell us how food tastes.
- Our noses smell pleasant and unpleasant odors.
- The skin on our hands and feet tells us how things feel.

In February, the children will be learning about water.
